THE MONTH OF JUNE

THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

The Blood and Water of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

It was at the Last Supper that John, the disciple "whom Jesus loved," reclined on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. (Jn. 13:23) Just hours later, at the foot of the Cross, it was John again who witnessed Jesus' Sacred Heart being pierced by a lance. He noted that "one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water." (Jn. 19:34) The early Church Fathers interpret the blood and water sacramentally, as symbols of the blood of the Eucharist and the waters of Baptism. The sacraments and the Church sprung from the wound of Christ's Heart. St. Augustine makes the connection that just as Eve was drawn from the side of Adam during his "deep sleep" (Gen. 2:21), so too, was the Church, the bride of Christ, drawn from the side of Jesus in His death. It is in the waters of Baptism and the blood of the Eucharist that the Church is born and sustained. The Church appropriately venerates the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which "He allowed to be pierced by our sins," as the definitive symbol of divine love towards humanity. (CCC 2669)

ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA FEAST DAY 13 JUNE

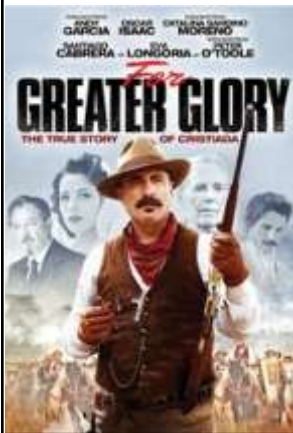
Saint Anthony was born Fernando Martins in Lisbon, Portugal. Following his ordination to the priesthood, he was responsible for the abbey's hospitality. He eventually joined the new Franciscan Order and changed his name to Anthony. He had a book of psalms that contained notes and comments to help when teaching students and, in a time when a printing press was not yet invented, he greatly valued it. When a novice decided to leave the hermitage, he stole the valuable book. When he discovered it was missing, he prayed it would be found or returned to him. The thief did return the book and in an extra step returned to the Order as well. Once, when St. Anthony of Padua attempted to preach the true Gospel of the Catholic Church to heretics who would not listen to him, he went out and preached his message to the fish. When critics saw the fish begin to gather, they realized they should also listen to what he had to say. He was only 36-years-old when he died and was canonized in less than one year. Upon exhumation some 336 years after his death, his body was found to be corrupted, yet his tongue was totally incorrupt, so perfect were the teachings that had been formed upon it. He is typically depicted with a book and the Infant Child Jesus and is commonly referred to today as the "finder of lost articles."

**FORTNIGHT FOR FREEDOM JUNE 21- JULY 4TH

"FOR GREATER GLORY"**



For Greater Glory is a movie, about the struggle for religious freedom in Mexico. The Cristero War began when the government began eliminating church privileges and seizing church properties throughout the country, in accordance with anti-clerical laws written into the Mexican Constitution. President Plutarco Elias Calles, who took office in 1924, focused on the Roman Catholic Church, which led to seizure of church property, the closing of religious schools and convents, and the exile or the execution of priests.

Blessed **José Luis Sánchez del Río** (28 March 1913 – 10 February 1928) was a Mexican Cristero who was put to death by government officials because he refused to renounce his Catholic faith. His death was seen as a largely political venture on the part of government officials in their attempt to stamp out dissent and crush religious freedom in the area.

At the Papal Consistory in March of this year, Pope Francis announced that Blessed Jose Sanchez will be canonized on the 16th of October 2016 in Rome.
