Today we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity, one God in three persons. Jesus tells Nicodemus that only those who are born from above will see the Kingdom of God. Nicodemus misunderstands and questions how a person can be born more than once. Jesus tells him that no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. Jesus is essentially explaining

Baptism, which we celebrate as a sacrament today. Jesus is testifying to the need to be born from above so that one might have eternal life.

In today’s focus on the mystery of the Holy Trinity, the reading calls our attention to the action of God, who reveals himself in three persons: God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. God the Father, out of love for the world, sent his Son into the world in order to save it. Through the death and resurrection of the Son, we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit. As three persons, God acts always as a God of love; he does not condemn the world but acts to save it.

The Gospel also calls attention to the response that is required of us. God’s love for us calls us to respond in faith by professing our belief in God’s son, Jesus, and the salvation that he has won for us. This profession of faith is a sign of the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives.



100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FATIMA APPARITIONS PLENARY INDULGENCE

Under the mandate of Pope Francis, the Church's centennial celebration of the apparitions of Fatima features a special plenary indulgence until Nov. 26, 2017 (the complete remission of all temporal punishment due to sin)



The plenary indulgence of the jubilee is granted:

To the pious faithful who visit with devotion an image of Our Lady of Fatima solemnly displayed for public veneration in any church, oratory or adequate place, during the days of the anniversary of the apparitions (the 13th of each month, from May to October 2017), and devotedly participate there in any celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary, pray the Our Father, recite the symbol of faith (Creed) and invoke Our Lady of Fatima;

Everyone is invited June 13th at noon in St. Aloysius church come to Pray the Rosary for the 100th Anniversary of the Fatima Apparitions.

A plenary indulgence can be gained once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace:

- Have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- Have sacramentally confessed their sins;
- Receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for the indulgence only Holy Communion is required); and
- Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
